Message from our Chair

The beginning of the school holidays has seen a massive upturn in the use of the park and especially our fabulous playground. It was great to have a number of new volunteers attending our monthly litter pick following our plea for help on Facebook they were staggered by the amount of litter that they collected in a short period of time. Hopefully they will return this month and we will have some new helpers. All equipment provided and no training necessary! Come join us please. We have a new group of gardeners volunteering to take care of the beds and planters but again more help would be appreciated.

Free play days continue to be offered to children during the summer break and it is lovely to see them enjoying the park.

We are still waiting for a firm date when Alder Hey will return the park in its entirety to the Council and Community. I recently attended a council planning committee to request that the pond in the park swale be reduced in size to reduce the risk it poses. My proposals were rejected but Alder Hey are now promising to provide some fencing to create a safer environment.

We, the Friends Group, continue to press the council to deliver some of the improvements it has promised, give us back our accessible seesaw, our swings, our musical instruments, restore barriers, resurface the area round the monument, carry on with the funding bid for the sensory garden and tackle antisocial behaviour by removing the benches in the woodland walk area.

We have also raised two other significant issues with the council; the continued abuse of the car park by construction workers from the hospital and the housing development site and others who are not even using the park and the need to reconfigure the car park to be more family friendly with reduction in disabled spaces.

There is also a problem being created with dogs being allowed to run off lead in areas where this is not permitted eg the playground and football pitch areas. A number of park users have raised both of these issues as matters of concern.

Some good news is that the football pitches will be marked and in use from next month, presumably the Council will then enforce the leashing of all dogs in the park. A number of girls teams will be playing regularly throughout the season. Plans are in place to also provide suitable storage facilities.
